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UNDERSTANDING YOUR MUD TAX RATE



Harris County Municipal Utility District 217 (MUD 217) plays a crucial role in providing essential services to the residents within its jurisdiction. The District's tax rate influences the funding available for development and operations.

Harris County MUD 217 is one of the numerous special purpose districts in the state of Texas. These districts were created to address the unique needs of specific geographic areas, providing water, wastewater, drainage services, recreational facilities, trash collection, and contract additional security and law enforcement. MUDs operate as special-purpose government entities, distinct from city or county governments, with their own boards of directors responsible for decision-making and governance. The primary source of revenue for these districts is the property tax paid by property owners within the district.



Your Current Tax Rate \$0.80 per \$100 of assessed value

Last Year's Tax Rate \$0.88 per \$100 of assessed value

Current Tax Exemptions

\$15,000 Over 65 and Disabled

Example:

Assessed home value of \$200,000 (with no tax exemption) for 2023 would make your MUD tax \$1,600.

Tax Rate Structure

Each fall the Board of Harris County MUD 217 sets a tax rate based on the district's financial requirements for the upcoming year. The rate is expressed in terms of cents per \$100 of assessed property value, which is determined by the Harris County Appraisal District.

Some homeowners qualify for special exemptions that reduce their tax burden by lowering the taxable value of the property from its appraised value.

Exemptions can include a **Homestead Exemption** (if the home is your primary residence) and **special exemptions** for those who are over 65 or disabled, and others.

Understanding the tax rate of Harris County MUD 217 is not only about individual financial obligations but also about contributing to the sustainable development of the community. Active collaboration between residents, the board of directors, and other stakeholders ensures that the district's resources are effectively managed to provide reliable and efficient services.


Participation in Public Meetings

MUD 217 regularly conducts public meetings where community members can obtain information about proposed budgets, tax rates, and upcoming projects. Actively participating in these meetings provides an opportunity to ask questions and express concerns. Meetings are held each month on the 4th Tuesday.

Engagement with the Board

The board of directors, elected by property owners, plays a crucial role in decision-making. Engaging with board members, attending meetings, and participating in the election process can influence policies related to tax rates.

As Texas continues to experience growth and demographic changes, the role of MUDs in supporting community infrastructure becomes increasingly vital. Residents and property owners within Harris County MUD 217 can play an active role in shaping the future of their community by staying informed, participating in meetings, and advocating for responsible financial practices. In doing so, they contribute to the resilience and sustainability of their neighborhood, fostering a thriving and well-supported community.



Harris County MUD 217 has been committed to reducing the tax burden on our home owners. Over the past 10 years, the tax rate has fallen from \$1.58 in 2013 to \$0.80 in 2023, a reduction of 49%. The Board continued this trend when it adopted its current \$0.80 rate.

Service & Collection Guidelines

Service Days and Hours

Trash: Monday & Thursday

Please have waste ready by 6:00 a.m.

Containers

Texas Pride Disposal will provide each household with one 65-gallon trash cart.

Holiday Schedule

Texas Pride Disposal observes three holidays: New Year's Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. In the event that your service day falls on a holiday, collection will roll to the next regularly scheduled collection day.

Household Trash

Place garbage in the provided cart. Excess waste can be placed in personal trash cans 20-96 gallons in size, or bags. Please limit cans and bags to no more than 50 pounds.

Yard Waste

Yard waste should be bagged or placed in cans not exceeding 50 pounds. Bagged yard waste should be placed curbside. Branches should be placed by garbage in bundles measuring no more than 4' x 4' x 4' and under 50 pounds. Limit 8 bundles per service day.

Heavy Trash & Bulk Waste

Up to two heavy trash/bulk items per service day. Items include furniture, appliances, carpeting (tied and bundled), fencing (nails removed, tied and bundled under 4' in length), and other items not disposed of regularly. Items should be by garbage and labeled TRASH.



Using any portion of a residential lot, other than a driveway or garage, for the parking of any motor vehicle, negatively impacts the overall appearance and the property values of the entire community. It is considered to be noxious and offensive for any vehicle to be parked at any time on a residential lot in any area other than on a paved driveway or within a garage. Boats, trailers, motor-homes, recreational vehicles, campers, semi-truck tractors, construction trailers, or any kind of similar vehicles may not be parked or kept within the Heritage Village neighborhood for any period of time, other than for temporary purposes, including loading and unloading.
